

The Timeline

Take advantage of new financing opportunities to continue to support and enhance Lincoln's excellent schools.



State Approvals

Project Overview

The bond will focus on three district priorities at each of the elementary schools.

- 1. New Gyms
- 2. New Science Labs
- 3. Renovated Cafeterias

HVAC, LED lighting, furniture and bathroom renovations, are being funded through the revolving fund, grants and Federal ESSER funds




Creating Opportunities Recap

In 2017, Lincoln voters approved a \$60M bond expecting to receive 35% reimbursement.

\$35,000,000

- In 2018, the State created new temporary incentives, which provided the High School project with an *additional* 17% or \$14.5M in extra funding.
- **Temporary bonuses** begin to expire at the end of 2023 that provide additional 18% reimbursement.
- Opportunity to **put this extra money to work** for Lincoln students and taxpayers.
- High quality school systems improve property values.




High School State Aid

The Funding Recap

Take advantage of new financing opportunities to continue to support and enhance Lincoln's excellent schools.

Bond Target Reimbursement Base Rate: 35% Health and Safety: 5% Educational Enhancements: 5% Alleviate Overcrowding: 5% Energy and Water Efficiency: 3% Total Anticipated Reimbursement: 53% Lincoln taxpayers would pay \$11.75M of the \$25M bond. Annual debt service payments will be **\$1M lower** than the expiring middle school bond.



The Need

Unlike the High School and Middle School, the Elementary Schools are not modern.

- The 2017 Statewide
 Assessment found \$20M+
 of building deficiencies
 and need in the four
 elementary schools.
 - Lonsdale, Northern, Central, and Saylesville
 "...are in need of square footage related to a cafeteria or library/media center..."



The Need – Lack of Space!

These schools have three times LESS space than they should compared to RIDE Regulations
