## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

~ Students must earn 23 credits as delineated in the Program of Studies, complete an Exhibition project, and demonstrate proficiency in Financial Literacy, and Computer Science.



~ Students earn ½ credit for successful completion of each semester course.

~ 7 credits x 4 years = 28 Total Potential Credits



## REQUIRED CREDIT DISTRIBUTION

- ~ English 4 credits Grade 9, 10, 11 & 12
- ~ Mathematics 4 credits Grade 9, 10, 11 & 12
- ~ Social Studies 3 credits Grade 9, 10 & US History Grade 11
- ~ Science 3 credits Grade 9, 10 & Biology Grade 11
- ~ Physical Education/Health 2 credits Grade 9, 10, 11 & 12
- ~ Civic Responsibility 1/2 credit
- ~ World Language- 2 years (one can be in middle school)



#### REQUIRED CREDIT DISTRIBUTION



- ~ Fine Arts 1/2 credit
- ~ Choice of Electives 6 credits\*
- ~ \* One elective credit must be an Authentic & Applied Learning Elective
- ~ \* Students must demonstrate proficiency in Financial Literacy and Computer Science

- ~ Many colleges require that a student follow certain recommended or prescribed courses of study in high school in preparation for entrance into college.
- ~ Students should consult college catalogues and their counselor regarding the specific requirements of the colleges to which the student intends on applying.

~ English 4 credits

~ Mathematics 4 credits

~ Social Studies 3+ credits

~ Lab Sciences 3+ credits

~ World Language 2 - 4 credits

~ Physical Education / Health 2 credits

~ Choice of electives including Fine Arts and LHS Proficiency Based Graduation Requirements, Financial Literacy, Computer Science

~ A minimum of 18 college preparatory units should be earned.

#### APPLIED LEARNING ELECTIVE



- ~ Courses that meet the applied learning elective requirement challenge students to deeply apply their knowledge through performance based assessments and tasks.
- ~ Students may take a full year 1 credit course or two ½ credit semester courses.
- ~ Applied learning credit elective course options are designated in the Program of Studies.

# PROFICIENCY BASED GRADUATION EXHIBITION

- TINCONS.
- ~ An approved extended research project on a topic of your choice
- ~Specifically designed for every LHS student to demonstrate proficiency in the Applied Learning Standards--Problem Solving, Critical Thinking, Research, Communication, Reflection, Evaluation
- ~ Students are enrolled in ½ credit semester class during their Junior Year to work independently and present their findings to a panel of judges that consist of teachers and community members

### FINANCIAL LITERACY PROFICIENCY



~ Students must demonstrate proficiency in Financial Literacy.

#### There are two ways to do so:

- 1. Enroll in a full year or half year Personal Finance course
- 2. Complete independent modules on EverFi during Lion Block throughout the school year.

#### **COMPUTER SCIENCE PROFICIENCY**



~ Students must demonstrate proficiency in Computer Science.

## Here are some ways to do so:

- 1. Enroll in a computer science course
- 2. Enroll in our Computer Science CTE program
- 3. Proficiency measures adhering to RIDE guidance

#### COURSE SELECTION GRADE 9

All ninth grade students are required to take the following courses

- ~ English (1 Credit)
- ~ Social Studies (1 Credit)
- ~ Mathematics (1 Credit)
- ~ Science (1 Credit)
- ~ Physical Education & Health (1/2 credit)
- ~ The remaining 2 ½ credits will be selected from the full credit and half credit course list.
- ~ Students are strongly encouraged to take a World Language Course in their Freshmen year.



## Student Requests in Skyward

1. Log into Skyward Student Access via the web. The mobile app will not work for course requests.

2. Select "Schedule"




3. Click on "Request Courses for 2024-2025 in Lincoln High School"

#### 4. To choose your "Selected Courses":

a) Highlight desired courses in the list of "Available Courses for 2024-2025" b) Use the "Add Course" button to move courses into your "Selected Courses" list c) Highlight a course in the "Selected Courses" list and choose "Remove Course" to remove it



d) Select 2.5 credits worth of courses in your "Selected Courses" list





5. You will also enter "Alternate Courses".

#### Here is the process:

- a) Click on "Request Alternates"
- b) Under "Selected Alternate Courses" you will see the courses you have selected from your "Selected Courses" list
- c) To add alternate requests, highlight a course from the "Available Courses for 2023-2024" list and use the "Add Course" button to move the course into your "Selected Alternate Courses" list
- d) Highlight an alternate course in the "Selected Alternate Courses" list and choose "Remove Course" to remove it.

The alternate course requests will be numbered. You can use the up and down arrows the number your choices from 1 to 4. The number 1 alternate course will be considered first if alternate courses are added to your schedule. Please select 4 alternate course requests.
